INSPIRATION EXAMPLE 2

Mud Island River Walk - Roy Harrover, 1982. River walk is an exact scale model of the Lower Mississippi River flowing from its confluence with the Ohio River at Cairo, Illinois 954 miles south to the Gulf of Mexico.



INSPIRATION EXAMPLE 3

Tree of Tenere - Symmetry Labs, 2017.

An enormous climbable tree with 25,000 LED leaves, this project was based on a solitary tree in southern Sahara Desert that became an important ceremonial gathering place for traders and travelers as they crossed the desert.



INSPIRATION EXAMPLE 4

Fog Assembly - Olafur Eliasson, 2016. An ephemeral work that changes in appearance according to the qualities of the sunlight and the wind, Fog Assembly produces a continual outpouring of swirling mist that dissolves the boundaries and outlines of the objects it encounters.



INSPIRATION EXAMPLE 5

Rain Yard - Stacy Levy, 2013. Rain Yard is an interactive artwork on permanent display in the Schuylkill Center's Sensory Garden that mitigates stormwater runoff from the building and highlights the critical role that soil and plants play in the water cycle.



INSPIRATION EXAMPLE 6

Pulse - Janet Echelman, 2017. Inspired by Dilworth Park's historic associations with transportation, Pulse traces the path of trains traveling on the three lines below the park in real time, coded to the colors associated with each transit line.
